The new per-minute rates are DKK 2.95 during the day, DKK 1.95 during the night, and the price for sending a SMS is DKK 0.75. If you choose to refill your Mobiltid card on the Internet, you save an additional 10 percent. "We know that many of our customers are happy with Mobiltid because they feel comfortable knowing the size of the phone bill in advance. Mobiltid is distributed through 5,000 dealers throughout Denmark. Here you can buy more phone time, but you can also buy it on the Internet if you prefer that," says Anders Christjansen, Vice-President of TDC Mobile. "Mobiltid is of high interest right now, as many people wish to be in contact with friends and family while they are on holiday, but at the same time to have full control over their phone bill," adds Anders Christjansen.
